Note: Jacklyn Harold (Jack) Lucas (February 14, 1928 – June 5, 2008), an American Marine in World War II, was awarded the Medal of Honor at the age of 17 years as a private first class during the Battle of Iwo Jima. During a close firefight in two trenches between Lucas and three Marines with 11 Japanese soldiers, Lucas saved the lives of the other three Marines from two enemy hand grenades thrown into their trench by unhesitatingly placing himself on one grenade, while in the next instant pulling the other grenade under him. The grenade he covered with his body exploded and wounded him severely; the other failed to explode. He is the youngest Marine and the youngest serviceman in World War II (1942-1945 as PFC) to be awarded the United States' highest military decoration for valor. He later commissioned into the United States Army (1961-1965) and reached the rank of Captain; On October 7, 2023, the United States Navy commissioned the USS Jack H. Lucas (DDG 125) in his honor at the Port of Tampa, Tampa Bay Florida.
